We continue to search for a satellite provider to assist missionary Brad Wells ("Bible FM") with returning 7 translator stations to the air, and to reach all 19 provinces in the country through radio. An earlier possibility for these services came to an unfruitful end when we found that they could not cover Papua New Guinea. We have contacted another provider that does have coverage of that area and are waiting for answers on feasibility of using their satellite services.

Missionary Matt Allen is going forward with the construction of a radio station to reach his area, although the availability of satellite programming from Bible FM is important in order to provide the kind of programming needed to reach his people.

Pray that we will quickly locate an afford-

able satellite provider, and be able to see the Gospel reaching the entire country of Papua New Guinea through radio! Also, pray that the construction of the new station will proceed on schedule and remain affordable.

back in November, KaraTek's Associate Director Paul Williams, and I were in Yokota, Japan working with a U.S. Military church on their sound and video system, as well as their internet radio station. The last day we were in Yokota we were able to take a sight seeing trip into downtown Tokyo. While on the subway train, we were able to see all kinds of history, and had a great day. But whenever you see the history of a great country that has grown without God, you cannot help but realize how lost these people really are. They worship their ancestors and Buddha, without getting one answer to their prayers. But the saddest part of the whole trip was that people, because of their hopelessness, were committing suicide by jumping in front of the trains. The passengers on the train were disturbed, not because someone died, but because it was causing a delay in their day. They

WVGV UPDATE

Please pray for Araiza Ministries and WVGV, West Union, WV. We are currently finalizing the technical specifications for their antenna to mount on top of a nearby tower. The design will have to meet structural engineering requirements to secure the antenna at the best possible location.

A new course in Church Sound Systems will be available in June. Executive Director Martin Gibbs is currently teaching the course at Riverview Baptist Bible Institute (RBBI) and videos are being recorded. These will be edited to produce a course that churches can use to improve the quality of their sound

the most important part of a station. Expensive equipment and even well trained operators are great but what does your station really portray as it's message? Who will you reach? How will you get them to listen and stay tuned?

day. Some stations are all music, some are all talk. Other stations are of a mixed format. In larger market areas a station can specialize in one particular format because a larger market exists from which to solicit listeners. In a small town or rural area a station ought to have more variety because of a smaller audience and a wider cross section of people types and preferences. Remember, a radio station is a ministry to reach varied types of people.

Your station should, first of all, glorify Jesus Christ and send out the message of salvation by faith in Him. Secondly, there should be

good teaching and encouragement via preaching or teaching, music, and even short devotional or dramatic programs.

Third, we should not forget the children. So much of our children's attention and imagination is drawn away by the ungodly values of the world. Good programming should include a healthy dose of children's programming scheduled at proper times. Perhaps a short devotion that is 5 minutes or less in the morning and then some programs in the early evening for parent's to use as leverage for homework to be finished. Saturday morning would also be a very important time to lure children away from the TV animation that destroys their imaginative abilities. Personally, I enjoy animation but there is a time and place for it.

LPFM PLANNING... TIME IS RUNNING OUT!

KaraTek continues to monitor the status of LPFM

legislation that is poised to open the airwaves to as many as 3,000 new community stations across the USA. In order for this to happen, Congress must act on separate House (HR 1147) and Senate (S.592) bills that would revise the current FCC broadcast rules to "open up" these frequencies. Much progress has been made, but in today's uncertain political climate, we are still waiting for a final bill to be voted on, and Congress is focusing on other matters at this time. Please pray that the legislation will proceed quickly, and that churches across the USA would be burdened to establish their own radio station.
